Rules for organization and holding of sports events in Bulgaria in conditions of Covid-19, emergency epidemic situation and the specifics of the respective disciplines in equestrian sports

The Bulgarian Equestrian Federation approves the following rules for organizing and conducting the individual events in Bulgaria according to the specifics of the respective discipline.

1. Admission to the competition area

Only competitors and persons from their entourage are allowed to compete:

- which are asymptomatic (no runny nose, fever and / or other cold symptoms)
- who had no signs of illness during the week preceding the race and the days before it. In case they have symptoms, they are obliged to declare this fact.
- who did not have an elevated (over 37 degrees) temperature during the 72 hours preceding the competition
- Coronavirus survivors had two negative PCR tests and were quarantined for 30 days thereafter.

2. Measures during the competition

The organizer of the event develops for each individual competition a regulation and a plan including the planned measures for the organization of the respective event in accordance with the restrictive measures adopted by the government:

- The organizer-host of the competition to appoint a Person Responsible or Control (LOC) for compliance with the adopted measures.
- Creating conditions for maintaining distance between individuals in all places on the site such as a grandstand, main square, heating plot, dining areas, grandstands, toilets, etc.
- Construction of places and provision of disinfection: to the heating field, to the stands, to the feeding places, at the entrances of each stable (tent)
- Room for isolation in case of illness at the race until the arrival of a medical team
- Defining rules for mandatory use of masks and gloves in certain places and facilities.
- Organization of on-site parking for vehicles and cars
- Systems for communication of the participants with the office of the competition, the secretariat, the judge's tower and the separate sports facilities
- Organization for control and restriction of access for entry and work in the stables
- Submission of applications for participation of competitors and horses
- Hotel accommodation rules
- Rules and organization of meals
- Rules for movement within the site
- Rules for the organization of veterinary inspection
- Rules for using the heating pad
- Rules for construction of parkours and routes
- Rules for viewing parkours and routes

3. Obligations of the Person Responsible for Control (LOC) for compliance with the adopted measures

3.1. Vehicles

LOC organizes the reception and organizes parking of trucks and vehicles for horses. Parking should be in accordance with the distance of at least 3 m between vehicles.

3.2. Stables

- Accommodation of the horses in the stables according to a pre-prepared plan according to the requests.
- The establishment of a control organization for access to the stables against pre-arranged passes for no more than two passes per horse.
- Entering the stables is mandatory with the use of protective masks, and the responsible person is necessary to organize and control compliance with this requirement.
- Responsible for the disinfection organization before and after the competition for each stable. Providing hand sanitizer at the entrances to the stables from the moment the stables are opened until all the horses have left.
- Responsible for organizing the conditions for the availability of water for watering and washing horses, creating an organization for compliance with the required distance of 4 m between horses and 1.5-2 m between people. Distance of 4 m is necessary for saddle riding and unsaddling outside the stables in order to avoid accidents. If the horse is saddled and cleaned in the stable, this can only be done in the stable and not in the stable corridor.

3.3. Isolation room

- LOC is responsible for determining the isolation room in case of symptoms of illness during the competition until the arrival of a specialized medical team.

3.4. Seating and dining areas

- LOC is responsible for marking the seats for observation of the competition by athletes, coaches and other persons, observing a physical distance of at least 1.5 m between the persons
- Organizes the nutrition of people, creating an organization to comply with the required physical distance between individual customers, as well as compliance with legal requirements for this type of activity. We recommend organizing outdoors and in disposable utensils.

3.5. Hygiene

- LOK provides the opportunity for disinfection with hand detergent and water and soap for washing.
 - Determines the toilets for use by observing the measures for individual use, cleaning and regular disinfection. Mandatory cleaning and disinfection should be performed every hour.
- Blow drying is not allowed. Wherever it is necessary to use disposable paper towels and napkins. Dispose of all paper waste in bins with lids.
- Organizes the purchase of protective masks and gloves

3.6. Purchase of fodder

- LOC is responsible for the organization of the purchase and receipt of feed or other necessary. We recommend that this be done individually on an hourly schedule with mandatory use of protective masks.

4. Office and secretariat

- Applications for participation are submitted electronically. On-site requests are not accepted
- The competition office organizes its activities according to its capabilities. We recommend minimizing direct contacts. Entry one by one, obligatory after disinfection and with a protective mask. Equipping the office with protective masks, gloves and disinfectants, and disinfection is performed after each client.

- Communication with the secretary of the competition to be carried out via the Internet or telephone: requests, change start, re- registration, etc.
- In case of urgent need, direct contact should be made from a distance of at least 1.5 meters. Mandatory with a protective mask and hand disinfection.

5. Judges 'leadership and organization of the judges' tower

- The Judges' Tower should be situated with opportunities for jobs for 4 people, spaced at least 1.5 meters apart.
- When working, the judges and all technicians in the tower (including the dressage discipline) must use protective masks. Each time they enter the judge's tower, the judges disinfect their hands. Each judge uses a personal stopwatch and pen. It is preferable to use gloves.
- The judge of the bell and the timing system works with them after preliminary disinfection of their tools and hands. Minimize the use of sheets and supplies that have been in contact with other members of the judging panel.
- The radio for communication with the stewards is disinfected before use and is used only by one person in the judge's tower.
- The Secretary, who is also a spokesperson, is obliged to comply with all requirements for judges. Works with a pre-disinfected microphone that is not used by another person.
- Dressage judges and their secretaries should wear protective masks.
- The persons who collect the evaluation sheets by dressage should be wearing gloves.

6. Veterinary examination

- The place for veterinary examination must be able to accommodate three people at a distance of 1.5 m.
- Trail allowing a horse and rider to be at a distance of at least 2 m from the commission.
- The examining veterinarian and the person receiving the passports must wear protective masks and gloves.
- A place should be designated for the verification of passports and their completion by the veterinarian, if possible separated from other persons.
- We recommend that the veterinarian use a personal pen and gloves.
- There must be a separate place when entering the gate to record the pulse.

7. Heating area

- No more than 5 to 6 horses should be allowed in the warm-up area, depending on its size.
- There should be no close contact between the warm-up riders and horses.
- No more than 4 people, including the steward, should be allowed in the square at any time.
- Horsemen and stewards must wear protective masks and gloves.
- The steward's radio is personal and pre-disinfected.
- There should be a place for hand disinfection at the entrance of the square.

8. Construction of the course

- Workers and the Course designer are advised to wear protective masks and gloves.
- Disinfect hands or gloves each time you enter the area.
- To keep a distance of 1.5 between people at all times.

9. Examination of the course

- The course is considered with the recommended use of masks.

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- To observe a distance of at least 1.5-2 m between the participants from the different teams. An exception to this condition is a coach and rider (s) from the same team.

- No persons other than athletes and coaches and judges are allowed.
- The panel of judges may decide to examine the parkour in groups in order to maintain the required distance.

10. Rewarding

- There is no official award ceremony.
- Rosettes, cash prizes and others are received upon receipt of passports.
- Passports are received from the office of the competition in compliance with the measures specified in the office section.

11. Endurance

- In the endurance discipline, all persons from the teams in the recovery and rest areas should be wearing masks.

12. Dressage and all-round riding

- In dressage tests, judges and their secretaries should be at a distance of 1.5 - 2 m.
- Observe the above rules for heating areas
- When inspecting the cross route, follow the rules for examining parkours

13. Other provisions

- Based on the general rules of FEI, the judging panel for medical reasons has the right to remove from the competition each participant.
- The Jury has the right not to allow or suspend a competitor if he or a person from his entourage does not comply with these or other provisions related to the anti-epidemic situation.
- The Organizing Committee should print and paste these rules next to the stables, the heating pad and the usual place to place the starting sheets.

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III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

All competing horses must be serologically tested (Coggins Test) for Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA). This test must have been carried out within the last 6 months. The certificate showing a negative test must be presented to the veterinarian examining the horse on arrival. Horse that have no such certificate or have a positive test will not be allowed to enter the showground and will not be allowed to compete in the event. Square for Organiser to include additional details if necessary

4. PONIES

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IX and Annex IX: For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement if requested by the FEI.

5. INJURY SURVEILLANCE

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

VACCINATION	PROTOCOL	ELIGIBILITY TO ENTER VENUE
Primary Course	1 st Vaccination: day 0 2 nd Vaccination: day 21-92	May compete 7 days after the 2 nd Vaccination

Boosters	MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination IF COMPETING: must be in the 6 months +21 days of the booster previous vaccination	Must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days before arriving at the Event Must not compete in the 7 days after receiving a vaccination

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these VRs. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1031

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1034-1042

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations Articles 1048-1053

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP). FEI Regulations, Chapter VII

8.1 SAMPLING. FEI Veterinary Regulations Chapter VII

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMPs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI Veterinary Regulations Article 1058

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in article 22.3 of the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. THE FEI POLICY FOR ENHANCED COMPETITION SAFETY DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

The FEI Policy for Enhanced Competition Safety during the Covid-19 Pandemic ("Policy") (<https://inside.fei.org/fei/covid-19/return-to-play/policy-tools>) is mandatory and applies for any FEI Event taking place **as of 1 July 2020**. The Policy has been developed based on currently accepted best practices by the WHO and US Center for Disease Control (CDC) and will be continually reviewed and updated as more information becomes available. It is not intended to replace the applicable guidance and policies from domestic government and health authorities, but to supplement their recommendations with sport specific considerations.

The OC shall submit the risk assessment and mitigation plan (including name and contact details of the person in charge) to the FEI as an annex to the Event Schedule, **at the latest ten (10) working days before the event's deadline for Definite Entries.**

Events for which the FEI has not received the documented risk assessment and mitigation measures plan in accordance with article 2.1.g) of the Policy **will be removed from the FEI calendar** in accordance with Article 112.3 of the FEI General Regulations.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK / WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Event and related activities, all Participants (as defined in the Policy) acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that:

1. Participation includes possible exposure to and illness from infectious diseases including but not limited to COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist; and,
2. The Participants knowingly and freely assume all such risks, both known and unknown, even if arising from the negligence of the OC or others, and assume full responsibility for their participation; and,

3. The Participants willingly agree to comply with the stated and customary terms and conditions for participation as regards protection against infectious diseases. If, however, a Participant observes any unusual or significant hazard during his/her presence or participation, the Participant will remove himself/herself from participation and bring such to the attention of the nearest official immediately; and,
4. The Participants, for themselves and on behalf of their heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD HARMLESS THE OC AND THE FEI, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants, sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the event ("RELEASEES"), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL ILLNESS, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE OF RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, to the fullest extent permitted by law.

The Participants confirm to have read this release of liability and assumption of risk agreement, fully understand its terms, understand that they have given up substantial rights.

2.INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

2.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL

2.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

2.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

2.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

2.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

2.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

2.2.2 Additional Liability Information

2.2.3 Horse Insurance

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

3. PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

4. DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

5. MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the Approval of the Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen

circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and Officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

6.ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER

In accordance with Art. 135.1 of the FEI General Regulations, athletes agree that their name and image and any photographs and moving images taken of them at an event may be used by the FEI and/or OC for the purposes of publicising the event and promoting the sport.

DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS:

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations articles 127 and 128)

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money announced for the competition. Distribution of prize money: distributed to 25 % of participants. If there are between 5 and 19 athletes in the competition, min 5 prizes must be distributed.

If there are 4 or less athletes in the competition, the table below applies.
