

III. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

2.HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.

ENTRY OF HORSES

Carnet ATA : needed if coming not from EU countries or in the case the horse will pass through not EU Countries (crossing not communitarian nations) For further information see: <http://www.atacarnet.com/> Official veterinary health certificates on the International Form issued from the official Veterinary Health Authorities of the Country of origin: a) for horses from EU Countries according to Annex II of Council Directive 2009/156/EC and subsequent amendments (Attention: valid only for 10 days). b) for horses NOT from EU Countries according to Annex II of Council Directive 92/260/EEC and Commission Decision 2004/211/EC and respective subsequent amendments. Health certificates and FEI Horse passports for all horses are to be handed to the Secretariat upon arrival to the venue. ONLY ORIGINAL documents must be presented, not a copy. Only trucks certified and accompanying persons possessing documents for horse transport can cross borders to enter EU countries. Athletes that need the health certificates for transport of the horses to their destination abroad validated from an official state Veterinarian, must declare it at the Secretariat upon arrival. OC will secure the presence of an official state Veterinarian at a certain time frame only on one day of the Event. Day and time will be announced at the Secretariat. For questions or problems, please contact your Government Veterinary Services.

3.NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

All competing horses must be serologically tested (Coggins Test) for Equine Infectious Anaemia (EIA). This test must have been carried out within the last 12 months. The certificate showing a negative test must be presented to the veterinarian examining the horse on arrival. Horse that have no such certificate or have a positive test will not be allowed to enter the showground and will not be allowed to compete in the event.

4.PONIES

Ponies must be in compliance with the Veterinary Regulations Chapter IX to be eligible to compete in pony events.

5.INJURY SURVEILLANCE

FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VIII: Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; and in the event of fatality, a post-mortem examination.

6.TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in suitable vehicles. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to comply with national legislation in both their country of origin and the host nation of the Event. Where necessary athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.

7.VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

7.1 PASSPORTS. FEI General Regulations.

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation.

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.

NB: Horses entered in CIMs in their country of residence are not required to have an FEI Passport or FEI Recognition Card but must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable (FEI General Regulations).

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated or fail to meet other passport requirements will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex VI of the FEI Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

NB for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union: all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

7.2 VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1003

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations.

All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMS) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.

7.3 EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1029

On arrival at an Event venue, all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport and micro-chip ID (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status concerning vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue. PRs must fulfil the Horse Health Requirements via the FEI HorseApp in advance of the event which will be checked at the Examination on Arrival.

7.4 HORSE INSPECTIONS. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1032-1040

All Horses will be assessed for their fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection. Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

7.5 LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1046-1051 and Annex VIII

All Horses are subject to examination under the protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the period of an Event. For Jumping that includes, but is not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. For Endurance that includes, but is not limited to, pre-ride, during the ride and after the ride. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event. Horses may be selected for examination under the protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the examination or are subject to immediate disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

8. EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME (EADCMP).**8.1 SAMPLING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VII**

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures. Refer to FEI Financial Charges for details of fees relating to Equine and Human Anti-Doping program (EADCMP), which OCs/NFs have the right to charge to the athlete (applicable for all FEI events worldwide).

8.2 ELECTIVE TESTING. FEI Veterinary Regulations, Art. 1056

Elective Testing may be carried out prior to an Event to check for the presence of Prohibited Substances. Please refer to <https://inside.fei.org/fei/cleansport/horses> for information and details.

XIII. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

Athletes can be tested at any FEI Event, by the FEI or by other Anti-Doping Organisations with Testing jurisdiction. Organisers will have the responsibility to provide facilities and staff/volunteers to facilitate such Testing if requested by the FEI as outlined in the FEIs' Anti-doping Rules for Human Athletes (ADRHA).

XIV. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**1.INSURANCES AND NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS**

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the FEI Event Organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or Horses at or in connection with an FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

1.1 ATHLETES, OWNERS AND SUPPORT PERSONNEL**1.1.1 Personal Accident and Health Insurance**

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/ Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at FEI Events and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at a FEI Event.

You should check with your National Federation to confirm if your National Federation's insurance policy (if any) covers personal accidents and/or illnesses which may occur when you are attending at/participating in FEI Events.

If your National Federation does not have a personal accident/health insurance policy or if the National Federation's insurance policy does not cover personal accident or health claims, then you should obtain your own personal accident and health insurance policy to cover your attendance/participation at FEI Events.

1.1.2 Personal Property Insurance

You should also ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at an FEI Event.

Again, the advice is to check with your National Federation to confirm if they have an insurance policy in place which would cover you in case of such property loss, theft or damage. If not, then you should obtain your own personal property insurance to cover such situations.

1.1.3 Press Equipment

Press equipment and other items left in the Press workroom, Press lockers, the Press Tribune or anywhere on the showgrounds are left entirely at the owner's risk. The Organising Committee does not accept any responsibility for any loss or damage to such equipment or items. Members of the Press are advised not to leave any equipment or personal items unattended.

1.2 ATHLETES AND OWNERS

1.2.1 Third Party Liability Insurance

As an Athlete/Owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses. You are, therefore, strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to FEI Events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, Support Personnel, your agents or your Horses.

1.2.2 Additional Liability Information

As an Owner you should ensure that your Horses are adequately insured against any injuries or illnesses they may sustain while participating at a FEI Event.

2.PROTESTS/APPEALS

3.DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

4.MODIFICATION TO SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the Approval of the Chefs d'Equipe, host NF delegate, if any, and the Ground Jury, the OC may change the schedule in order to clarify any matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and Officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

5.ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FROM THE ORGANISER**DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY AT COMPETITIONS:**

Full details of any deductions from prize money must be outlined in the schedule. This includes government taxes. If it is necessary for Organisers to deduct such taxes, they must provide participants with an official form indicating the amount of tax deducted.

The tax form must be provided to the athletes upon arrival and returned to the Organiser prior to departing.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (FEI General Regulations)

The value of the 1st prize must not exceed 1/3 of the total prize money announced for the competition. Distribution of prize money: distributed to 25 % of participants. If there are between 5 and 19 athletes in the competition, min 5 prizes must be distributed.

If there are 4 or less athletes in the competition, the table below applies.

Please note that as per the FEI Regulations: OCs of International Events must inform the FEI and NFs whose teams or individuals have taken part, of the results and prize money paid to each placed Athlete and team, within two (2) days following the Event for all disciplines managed by an online entry system and five (5) days for all other discipline(s), unless otherwise specified for qualification and ranking reasons as communicated by the FEI.

Failure from organisers of International Events to provide the FEI with the appropriate result(s) and/or prize money information by the aforesaid deadline and/or in the aforesaid format shall entail a warning for the first violation and thereafter a fine of CHF 1'000.- per violation.

3. EEF DRESSAGE EVOLUTION LEAGUE RULES – TEAM COMPETITION.

1. EEF Dressage Evolution League

EEF Dressage Evolution League (EEFDEL) consists of Regional Qualification Events (RQ) and a Final.

EEFDEL season: All EEFDEL RQ are held during the period May to September and are outdoor shows.

The Final may be held as an indoor or outdoor event.

The number of EEFDEL RQs in 2023 is six (6). The venues and dates of the EEFDEL RQs will be communicated before the start of the season but in any case before end of January 2023.

EEFDEL shows are organised as CDIP, CDICH, CDIJ, CDIY, CDI1*.

Countries eligible to host EEFDEL shows are: AUT, BUL, CRO, CZE, EST, GRE, HUN, LAT, LUT, POL, ROU, SLO, SVK, TUR.

All NFs, which are members of FEI are invited to take part at each CDI and can compete as a Team for the EEF Dressage Evolution League.

The shows shall be hosted in three regions (Baltic, Central and Balkan) and each Region may host a maximum of two (2) RQs.

The Teams are mixed teams with Athletes from different age categories, from Children/Pony Riders to Seniors.

In 2023, the shows will be run as single events, not as a league and they will be named EEF Dressage Evolution Team Competition. This name will be added to the approved schedule.

2. Team competition

2.1. Composition of the teams

Each team consists of a minimum three (3) and maximum four (4) Athletes, from the Pony Riders, Children, Junior, Young Riders or Senior categories, with one representative maximum per category. All Athletes and Horses must be FEI registered and duly entered by their National Federation.

Each OC decides which of the five (5) categories to include at each show and this must be stated in the approved schedule.

The Athletes can be from the same nation, but this is not obligatory. Athletes from different nations can compose a team.

The starting order of the teams is determined by an ordinary draw.

An Athlete who is not part of any team or member of a team but is competing with a second Horse, will start following all team Athletes following their own age group competition.

The starting order of the Athletes is: first start all Pony Riders, then all Children, then all Juniors, then all Young Riders and finally all Seniors.

Athletes will ride the following tests:

- Pony Riders: Team test,
- Children: Team test,
- Juniors: Team test,
- Young Riders: Team test,
- Seniors: Prix St Georges test.

2.2. Ranking:

Team Classification.

In each category, Team Athletes will receive points as follows:

The best ranked Athlete in his category will receive points equal to the number of teams which take part in the competition. The second best placed Athlete receives points equal to the number of teams minus one and so on.

The winning team is the one having the highest total points of their three (3) best Athletes. The second best team is the one with the next highest total points and so on.

If there is a tie for any place, the deciding factor will be the accumulated final score in % of the three (3) best Athletes from the team. If there is still a tie, the teams will be placed equal.

2.3. Team manager

Every team has to declare a Team manager. The Team manager has to be an adult. The Team manager could also be an Athlete member of the team. The Team Manager is the spokesperson and designated representative of a team.

2.4. Declaration of the teams

The Team Manager will declare the name of his team and its members at the technical meeting, but not later than thirty (30) minutes following the horse inspection.

Substitution of Athletes and/or Horses is allowed not later one (1) hour before the start of the team competition. This substitution request has to be presented to the Ground Jury President for approval.

If an Athlete is entered with two (2) different Horses in different categories, the Athlete can decide in which EEF Team competition they will take part. Such Athlete can only take part in one (1) EEF Team competition, but the Athlete is eligible for individual ranking with both Horses in both categories.

3.EEF Dressage Evolution League Final

3.1. Participation

The top two (2) ranked teams from each qualifying event qualify for the EEFDEL Final.

If a team which is already qualified cannot take part at the Final, it will be replaced by the next best ranked team in the RQ, not already qualified for the Final, where the team achieved qualification.

If this team has achieved qualification at more than one (1) RQ, it will be replaced by the next team at the first RQ where the qualification was achieved. If this next team cannot take part, then the qualification for the Final will go to the next team at the second RQ where qualification was achieved and so on.

Teams will have the same Names as they had at the RQs.

In order to be eligible to participate in the final, each Team must include at least two (2) Athletes who participated for the Team in at least one (1) RQ.

Subject to the foregoing, substitution of Athletes and/or Horses are allowed not later than one (1) hour before the start of the team competition. The request for substitution has to be presented to the Ground Jury President for approval.

3.2. Format and Ranking

The format and ranking at the EEFDEL Final is according to Art. 2.2. of these rules.

4.Branding**4.1. Name of the Team competition**

Name of the Team competition is: (name of the venue) EEF Dressage Evolution League.

4.2. Logo and Branding

The logo of the EEF and the logo of the League have to appear on all promotional material for the event including but not only: press releases, starting and results list, course plans.

Banners: the OC has to allocate 6 banners (approx. size 0.90 x 2.00 m) with design provided by EEF at the main arena and two banners at warming up arena.

4.3. Live streaming

The OC has to ensure that live streaming of the all three team competitions is provided.

5.Education

An educative event for national Dressage and Para Dressage Officials will be organized in connection with every EEFDEL show.
