THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

SECOND PART: COMPETITIONS REGULATIONS

<u>TECHNICAL CONDITIONS - CEREMONIES - PRIZES FOR THE JUMPING COMPETITIONS OF THE BEC.</u>

GENERAL

- **1.** The following Jumping Competitions, are organised for each category of competitors of the BEC and judged under FEI Rules for Jumping Events:
- **1.1.** Familiarisation: on the same day as the Veterinary Inspection and after the Technical Meeting the arena will be open with 8 to 9 obstacles and every rider will have for 90 sec the use of the arena. The same obstacles will be set at 1,00m for Children, then raised to 1,10m for Juniors, Amazons and finally raised to 1,20m for Young Riders and Seniors.
- **1.2.** A first Individual Qualifier Competition (speed competition) under Table A, Article A 238.2.1 for Children and Juniors and under Table C for Amazons, Young Riders and Seniors. Table C results will be converted into points according to the FEI provisions for Championships.
- **1.3.** A Team Competition over two rounds, judged under Article 264 Nations Cup, all teams taking part in the second round with all their Athletes.
- **1.4.** All individual riders will jump before the team riders.
- **1.5.** An Individual Grand Prix Competition, judged under Articles 261.5.1 and 238.2.2 over one round with a Jump-Off¹

2. <u>Individual Championship Placing</u>:

The placing for the title of the Individual Champion is decided by adding the penalties of each competitor in the first qualifying competition, in the two rounds of the team competition (Art. 264) and in the one round of the Individual Grand Prix Competition (Art. 261.5.1)

In the event of equality of penalties following the four rounds, the classification of the Individual Grand Prix Competition will be the deciding factor for the final classification for the Individual Championship. ²

3. Schooling of horses: it is noted that:

"Under penalty of elimination, it is prohibited for a competitor's horse to be schooled by anybody mounted in the saddle, other than the competitor himself or the trainer or a person delegated by the trainer with the owner's approval, in or outside the town where the event or a Championship is held as from 18.00 hours on the day preceding the commencement of the first competition of an event or a Championship until the conclusion of the whole event or Championship. However, lunging, work in hand, etc by someone other than the competitor,

under the supervision of the FEI stewards, are permitted".

FIRST INDIVIDUAL QUALIFIER COMPETITIONS

- **1.** The first Individual Qualifier Competitions are speed Competitions that are judged as follows:
- **1.1.** <u>for Children, Juniors and Young horses:</u> <u>Table A against the clock</u> (Art. 238.2.1) <u>without a jump-off</u> in the event of equality for the first place. If a competitor has been eliminated or has retired, he shall be penalised with 20 points more than the competitor with the highest number of penalties.
- **1.2.** for Amazons, Young Riders and Seniors: The competition will be judged under <u>Table C</u>. The <u>scores</u> obtained by each competitor will be converted into points by multiplying the time of each competitor by the co-efficient 0.50; the score must be corrected to 2 decimal places. The second decimal place will be rounded up to 0,005 and rounded down from 0,004. The competitor with the lowest number of points after this conversion will be given 0 (zero) penalties. The other competitors being credited with the number of penalties representing the difference in points between each of them and the leading rider. If a competitor is eliminated or does not complete his round for any reason, he will be awarded the same number of penalties as that incurred by the competitor who has been the most severely penalised, plus 20 penalties. If the competitor concerned has himself received the highest number of penalties before being eliminated or retiring, 20 penalties will be added to his score. Adding the 20 penalties is done after the time-difference has been converted into penalties.
- **2.** <u>Participation</u>: 4+2 competitors per invited nation for each category of competitors of the BEC and six (6) young horses per nation at the BalkanChampionship..
- **3.** Speed: 350m/min.
- 4. Obstacles:
- **4.1.** numbers:

Children: 10-12 obstacles including one triple and one double or two doubles.

Young horses: 10-12 obstacles including two double

All other: 10-12 obstacles, including one triple and one double or three doubles as well as a barred water jump.

- **6.1.** <u>For Children, Juniors and Young horses:</u> according to the faults and the time of the round. In the event of equality of faults and time there will be no jump-off.
- **6.2.** For Amazons, Young Riders and Seniors: according to the converted scores.

All teams take part in the second round with all their competitors. Nations Cup is judged under Table A not against the clock with a time allowed.

Young horses: Second qualification game is judged under FEI Art 238.2.1. In case of equal penalties and time there will not be any jump-off.

2. <u>Participation</u>: One team of four (4) or three (3) competitors per invited nation and max 4 individual for each category of competitors of the BEC.

The individual riders jump before the teams.

5. <u>Starting Order</u>: The starting order for the nations in the first round is determined by a draw at the end of the 1st Competition day. The Chefs d' Équipe of the teams with only three competitors may chose in which of the three places out of four they will start their competitors.

The starting order for the second round will be in reverse order of total penalties incurred by the team in the first round, the competitors of the teams higher placed starting last. Teams with equality of penalties will retain their drawn order among themselves.

There will be a separate draw for the individual competitors of NF that do not have a complete team. These competitors will start before the teams in both rounds, retaining their drawn order in the second round.

6. <u>Placing</u>: The penalties incurred by the best three competitors of each team in the first round are added to those of the best three competitors in the second round.

In case of a tie for any place the total times of the three best competitors in each team in the second round will be the deciding factor.

In case of equality of total penalties and total times for any place, the teams will be placed equal. In case of a Team being eliminated it will not be placed and it will not take part in the prize giving

<u>Young horses:</u> in accordance with penalties and time. Should they have the same number of penalties and equal time there will not be any jump-off.

INDIVIDUAL GRAND PRIX COMPETITIONS 6

1. The Individual Grand Prix Competitions are judged under Article 261.5.1 & 238.2.2 over one round with a jump off.

The competitions are judged under Table A against the clock, but in the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock. Other competitors are placed according to their penalties and time in the first round.

A. In connection with the first ceremony, concerning the final results of the Grand Prix competition:

- **7.1.** The first 5 best placed competitors will be invited to the prize giving ceremony.
- **7.2.** A cup will be offered to the Grand Prix winner and rosettes for their horses.
- **8.** Young horses, 6 and 7 years old (6 years old -1.25m, 7 years old -1.30m): Should they have the same number of penalties there will be a jump-off with obstacles the height of which remains the same.

PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY FOR THE BALKAN JUMPING CHAMPIONS.

- **1.** In connection with the ceremony concerning the final results of the Balkan Individual Jumping Championship:
- **1.1.** The first 5 best placed competitors, will be invited to the prize giving ceremony, which takes place immediately after the relevant Grand Prix Competition for all categories except Seniors (i.e. Children, Juniors, Young Riders, Amazons) and during the closing ceremony for the Seniors category.
- **1.2.** The winner along with the title of the Balkan Jumping Champion will receive a gold medal, the second a silver medal and the third a bronze medal.
- **1.3.** The competitors invited to the ceremony will receive one diploma each certifying their placing in the Balkan Individual Jumping Championship and their horses will receive one rosette each.
- **1.4.** The national anthem of the Balkan Individual Jumping Champion will be played while the national flags of the three first Balkan Individual Jumping Champions will be hoisted.
